

### Introduction

Our firm, Rincon Pacific Management Inc. dba SB Wealth, is an investment adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. We feel that it is important for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. There are free and simple tools available to research firms and financial professionals at [www.investor.gov/CRS](http://www.investor.gov/CRS), which also provides educational materials about investment advisers, broker-dealers, and investing.

### What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We are a registered investment adviser that offers investment advisory services, including Managed Portfolios to clients which consists of asset management and financial planning or consulting. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we'll meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, objectives, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we'll recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored at least quarterly, and if necessary, rebalanced to meet your changing needs and goals. We'll offer you advice on a regular basis and contact you at least annually to discuss your portfolio.

We manage accounts on a discretionary basis. After you sign an agreement with our firm, we're allowed to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you in advance. Any limitations will be described in the signed advisory agreement. We will have discretion until the advisory agreement is terminated by you or our firm.

We do not restrict our advice to limited types of products or investments.

Our firm requires a minimum account balance of \$25,000 to open and maintain an account for our Managed Portfolio services. This minimum is negotiable at our firm's discretion and can be considered with other account you open with our firm if the balance is less than \$25,000.

Financial Planning or Financial Consulting is included in our Managed Portfolio service for no additional fee.

### What fees will I pay?

You will be charged an ongoing quarterly fee based on the value of the assets in your account on the last day of the prior quarter. Our Managed Portfolio fee schedule range up to 1.75% depending on the value of the assets in your account. The less assets you have in your advisory account, the less you will pay us. We therefore have an incentive to grow the assets in your account so we can earn more fees. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. Our firm's fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, we will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our fees from your advisory account.

The custodian that holds your assets may charge you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you. The custodian transaction fees are in addition to our firm's fees for our Managed Portfolio service.

You may also pay charges imposed by the custodian holding your accounts for certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, exchange traded funds, and variable annuities, charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time. In addition, you may have to pay fees such as "surrender charges" to sell variable annuities.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

**What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?**

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

Our firm's financial professionals are registered representatives of SA Stone Wealth Management Inc. ("SA Stone"), an unaffiliated broker-dealer. Your financial professional may offer you brokerage services through SA Stone or advisory services through our firm. Brokerage and advisory services are different, and the fees our firm and SA Stone charge for those services are different. Registered representatives charge a transaction-based commission each time they buy or sell a security in a brokerage account. As a result, they have an incentive to trade as much as possible in order to increase their compensation.
