Introduction

Our firm, Hendricks Wealth and Estate Management, is an investment adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. We feel that it is important for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. There are free and simple tools available to research firms and financial professionals at www.investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about investment advisers, broker-dealers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We are a registered investment advisor that offers investment advisory services to retail investors. Our advisory services include Comprehensive Portfolio Management and Financial Planning & Consulting. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we'll meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, goals, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we'll recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored at least quarterly, and if necessary, rebalanced to meet your changing needs, stated goals and objectives. We'll offer you advice on a regular basis and contact you at least annually to discuss your portfolio.

Financial Planning & Consulting is included in our Comprehensive Portfolio Management and Wrap Comprehensive Portfolio Management services for no additional fee. The scope of the planning services under our Comprehensive Portfolio Management service is general in nature and provided verbally through client meetings. Targeted-scope Financial Planning & Consulting, involving a written-financial plan, is also offered as a separate service for an additional flat and/or hourly fee. We do not monitor your investments for the Financial Planning & Consulting service.

You can select in our agreement whether we are allowed to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you in advance ("discretion") or only buy and sell investments in your account after receiving your permission ("non-discretion"). If you select non-discretion, you make the ultimate decision regarding the purchase or sale of investments. Any limitations will be described in the signed advisory agreement. We will have discretion or non-discretion until the advisory agreement is terminated by you or our firm.

We do not restrict our advice to limited types of products or investments. Our firm does not impose requirements for opening and maintaining accounts or otherwise engaging us.

- What is your relevant experience, including your licenses, education and other qualifications? What do those qualifications mean?

What fees will I pay?

You will be charged an ongoing quarterly fee based on the value of the investments in your account. Our Comprehensive Portfolio Management maximum annual fee is 1.50%. The more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us. We therefore have an incentive to increase the assets in your advisory account in order to increase our fees. Our fees vary and are negotiable. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. Our firm's fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, our firm will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our firm's fees from your advisory account.

Our maximum flat fee is \$10,000 and/or maximum hourly rate is \$695 for our Financial Planning & Consulting service. We charge an upfront retainer when you sign an agreement and/or charge you when we provide a financial plan or consultation.

The broker-dealer that holds your assets charges you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you. The broker-dealer's transaction fees are in addition to our firm's fees for our Comprehensive Portfolio Management services. You may also pay charges imposed by the broker-dealer holding your accounts for



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certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, exchange traded funds, and variable annuities, charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time. In addition, you may have to pay fees such as "surrender charges" to sell variable annuities.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

Questions to Ask Us:

• Help me understand how these fees and costs may affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs and how much will be invested for me?

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

Representatives of our firm are licensed insurance agents. As a result of these transactions, they receive normal and customary commissions. A conflict of interest exists as these commissionable sales create an incentive to recommend products based on the compensation earned. To mitigate this potential conflict, our firm will act in the client's best interest. One Representative of our firm is a licensed attorney in the State of Illinois with Hendricks Law Office, P.C. These services are independent of investment advisory services and are governed under a separate engagement agreement with the Hendricks Law Office. Clients may be solicited to utilize these services; however, they are under no obligation to do so and our firm will act in the client's best interest.
