Meet Ty Olsen, a 17-year-old who has excelled as a student, an athlete, and a musician.

Ty is in the 11th grade at Heritage High School. He stays pretty busy with school and extra-curricular activities, but he puts 100% effort into each one, and it shows. For starters, he has not only kept up with his studies, but he has done very well in them. He maintains a high GPA as a member of the National Honor Society and is involved in FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America) as well.

Ty is a hard worker in the classroom and on the court. He plays on the Heritage High School basketball team and has accomplished great things in the sport including All-Conference Basketball Player, Academic State Champion, the Arvest Hoopfest All-Tournament, and the state tournament.
