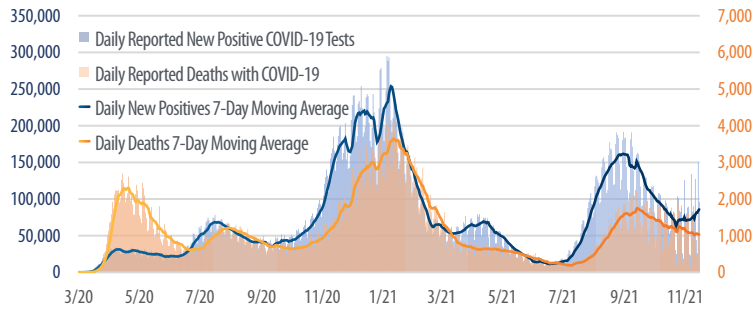

Daily Reported New Positive COVID-19 Tests vs. Daily Reported Deaths from COVID-19 in the U.S.

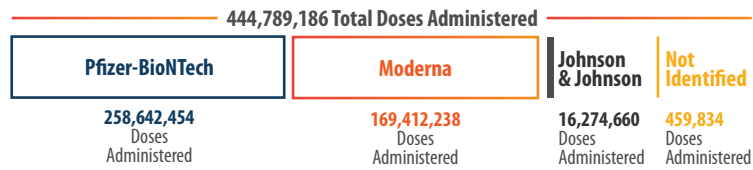

U.S. COVID-19 Vaccine Doses Administered by Vaccine Type

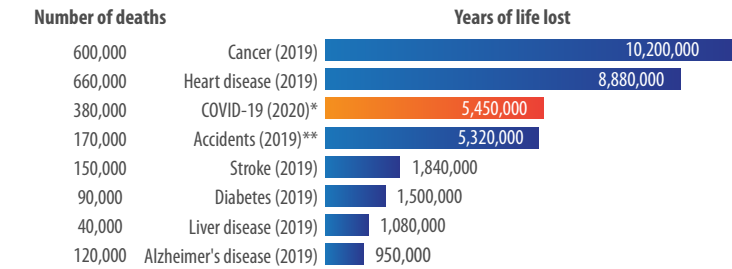

Number of Deaths and Years of Life Lost in the U.S. by Cause

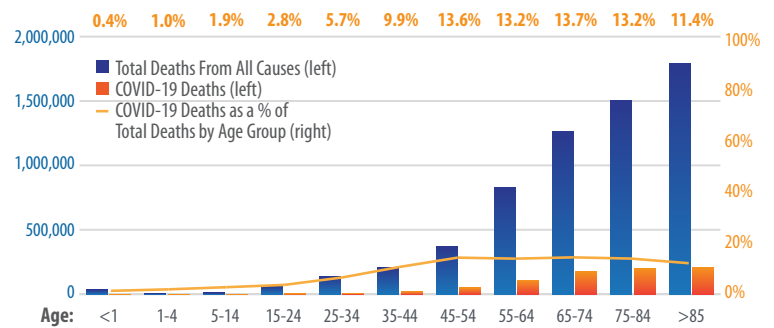

Total Deaths and COVID-19 Deaths in the U.S. by Age Group

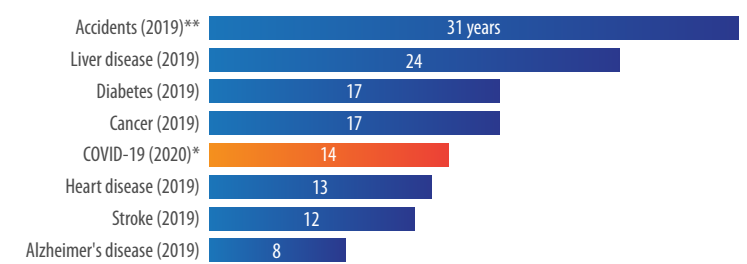
January 1, 2020 - November 13, 2021

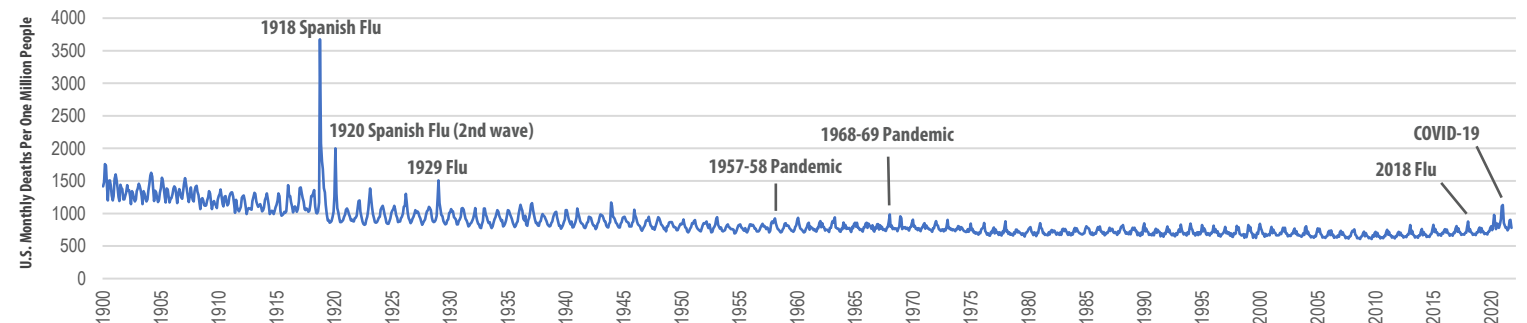

In the 12-month period that ended in April more than 100,000 Americans died of overdoses, up almost 30% from the 78,000 deaths in the prior year, according to provisional figures from the National Center for Health Statistics. Overdose deaths have more than doubled since 2015.¹

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) is suspending enforcement of the Biden administration's COVID-19 vaccine mandate for large private businesses pending litigation after a federal appeals court upheld a stay on it last week. The mandate would require all private employers with 100 or more employees to mandate vaccines or weekly testing for all personnel, a guideline that has the potential to impact nearly 80 million workers.²
