

BACON BROWN SUGAR GARLIC CHICKEN

Yield	Prep Time	Cook Time	Total Time
6 Servings	5 minutes	25 minutes	30 Minutes



Ingredients:

- 2/3 cup brown sugar packed
- 3 tablespoons garlic minced
- 3/4 teaspoon Kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 6 chicken breasts boneless and skinless
- 12 slices bacon

Instructions:

1. In a large bowl add the brown sugar, garlic, salt and pepper and mix until combined.
2. Coat the chicken in the brown sugar mixture.
3. Wrap each piece of chicken with two slices of bacon.
4. Place into your baking pan.
5. Top with the remaining brown sugar mixture.
6. Cook at 375 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until cooked through and browned.
7. Careful to not let the brown sugar burn and blacken.

The magnolia has long been a symbol, of the beauty and strength, of the south and its people. A tree that adorned the yards of most southern homes and can now be found all across the world. The tree was first introduced in Europe in 1731 and quickly became popular because of its shiny evergreen foliage, graceful form and huge showy blooms.

The tree is reported to be one of the oldest trees in existence. It has endured due to its ability to survive drought, pests and most plant diseases. It's bloom although delicate appearing is strong. Before bees were more widely populated, beetles pollinated the blooms and the weight of the beetle was better handled by these blooms. 
City National Rochdale's investment outlook





The labor report breathed some fresh air into the stock market, how strong was the report?

It was very strong. The December nonfarm payrolls jumped 312,000, which is about 100,000 more than the five-year average monthly gain. Furthermore, the two previous months were revised up by 58,000.

Despite more than nine years of economic expansion, the pace of hiring continues to improve. The 12-month average gain is 216,000, up from a recent

low of 176,000 in October 2017 (chart).

Wages increased and now stand at 3.2% y-o-y, the highest level in nine years.

The unemployment rate did increase to 3.9%, from 3.7%, but for good reasons, as the participation rate increased by 0.2pp to 63.1%. This is calculated from a separate survey.
